
GUITAR CHORDS IN G MAJOR


Principal Chords In G Major

The three principal chords in G major are the G, C, and D7th chords.



The change from the G chord to to the C will require a little more practice because the third finger in the G chord must move up to the fifth string to form the C chord shape.

Chord Progression 1.




- 1. As in the previous lesson practicing these chord in a number of different orders is recommended.
- 2. Careful attention to the sound of the tonic (G) to dominant (D7) chord progression is important.
- 3. Try and internalise the sound so you can recognise it when it appears in a song.
- 4. The dominant to tonic progression is the most important progression in western music and forms the basis of most of the music that we hear today.


